- Acrylic paint/Paint pens & markers, paint brushes, Decorative material and fevicol.
- Rock art should be based on theme 'Earth Day'.

Day & Date: Thursday, 21st April, 2022 (8th & 9th Period)

Description & Rules:

- 6 participants will be selected from each House.
- Participants must speak in English and refrain from using offensive language.

- Time limit: Maximum 8 minutes.
